SHORT INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS:

- Contributions should be written in high quality English. We kindly ask you to write the manuscript in Word. There is no limitation of the length of an individual Chapter. However, as a very rough estimate, we suggest a word count of minimum 5,000 to maximum 12,000. However, if you need more place, feel free to use more!

Please note:

The usage of these templates is not mandatory. Alternatively, you may use a blank Word document and apply the default settings and styles (e.g., for heading styles, lists, footnotes, etc.).

- Each chapter should begin with an abstract that summarizes its content in 150 to 250 words. The abstract will appear online at SpringerLink and be available with unrestricted access to

facilitate online searching, using e.g. Google, and allow unregistered users to read the abstract as a teaser for the complete chapter.

- Include a reference list at the end of each chapter so that readers of single chapters of the eBook can make full use of the citations. References at the end of the book cannot be linked to citations in the chapters.
